Film Nights

Sunday 28 April - *The Children Act*, 2018 (12A) Drama

Sunday 19 May - *The Favourite*, 2018 (15) Drama (with sexual content, nudity and language)

Both films start at 7.30 pm in the Village Hall, doors open at 7 pm. Bring a comfy chair and your own snacks if you wish, very reasonably priced drinks available. Tickets are £4 for adults and £2 for under 18s, available on the door.

The Children Act – based on the book of the same name by Ian McEwan (2014), this film is smart, elegant and deeply moving.

Fiona Maye (Emma Thompson) is an eminent High Court judge in London presiding with wisdom and compassion over ethically complex cases of family law. But she has paid a heavy personal price for her workload, and her marriage to American professor Jack (Stanley Tucci) is at a breaking point. In this moment of personal crisis, Fiona is asked to rule on the case of Adam (Fionn Whitehead), a brilliant boy who is refusing the blood transfusion that will save his life. Adam is three months from his 18th birthday and still legally a child. Should Fiona force him to live? Fiona visits Adam in the hospital and their meeting has a profound emotional impact on them both.

The Favourite – Winner of an Academy Award for Best Actress (Olivia Colman) and a BAFTA for Outstanding British Film, this period comedy masterpiece is brash, bawdy and utterly beguiling.

In the early 18th century Britain is at war with the French. A frail Queen Anne occupies the throne and her close friend Lady Sarah governs the country in her stead while tending to Anne's ill health and mercurial temper. When a new servant Abigail arrives, her charm endears her to Sarah, and she takes Abigail under her wing. As the politics of war become quite time consuming for Sarah, Abigail steps into the breach to fill in as the Queen's companion. Their burgeoning friendship gives her a chance to fulfil her ambitions.
